Amoni was a part of the Edmonton West Warriors since he was old enough to join the team. His allegiance to the Warriors has been unwavering, influenced by his older brother's involvement with the 2003 team. Amoni Thomas has recently transitioned to the Vancouver Whitecaps Academy in August 2022, and we are delighted to witness this significant step in his journey.

#### **BRIAN ANANIAS**

Edmonton Warriors player Brian Ananias signed his first pro contract for Radnik Bijeljina Football Club in Bijeljina, Bosnia and Herzegovina. He has also trained with the Vancouver Whitecaps Academy. He is one of EMSA's 2003 players who went to Nationals. We are so proud of his accomplishments and success in his career.

### **ALPHONSO DAVIES**

Alphonso Davies is a well-known name not only in Canada, but now across the world. Before he began his professional career with the Vancouver Whitecaps FC, he played in the North EMSA zone for Xtreme, and then moved to the Strikers and St Albert. By 2017, he was named one of the 60 best young soccer talents in the world and has already set countless records. He now plays for FC Bayern Munich and has been with the club since 2019. In the 2022 FIFA World Cup, Davies was called up to play and proudly scored Canada's first-ever World Cup goal. He is an example of not only incredible talent, but unwavering resilience and dedication as he inspires young players today.

## **ERIN MCLEOD**

An outstanding goalkeeper from Edmonton, McLeod has been a mainstay in the Canadian national team. Born in St. Albert, her performances in major tournaments have been crucial for Canada, and she has been a significant figure in promoting women's soccer in Edmonton.

## **STEPHANIE LABBÉ**

Stephanie Labbé is a goalkeeper who played for the Canadian national team and was a key player in international competitions, including the Olympics and World Cup. In her youth, she played for the EMSA Spruce Grove Saints and Mill Woods Warriors and in her professional career went on to bring home both a bronze and gold Olympic Medals. She is known for her remarkable goalkeeping skills and has been a role model for young soccer players in Edmonton and across Canada.

## **ASMIR BEGOVIĆ**

Asmir started playing in EMSA for SW Sting in his youth and in his professional career advanced to play in the Premier League as one of their best goalies. In 2013, he became the fifth goaltender to score a goal in the Premier League and currently holds the record for second-longest goal scored in football history. We're proud to have been part of his soccer journey.

#### **TOSAINT RICKETTS**

Tosaint Ricketts started playing soccer in the EMSA South West zone playing for SW Sting and Juventus. Throughout his professional career he played for 10 clubs in seven countries and represented Canada on the men's national team from 2011-2020 before he retired in 2023.

#### **DAVE GANTAR**

David Gantar was one of the highestranking referees in Canada and both played and coached in EMSA. He has been a Canadian National Referee since 2004 and became a FIFA Referee in 2011. In his first year as a FIFA ref, he officiated one major tournament, the CONCACAF Champions League, and 2014 FIFA World Cup Qualification. In 2019, Gantar was the match official for the debut game in the Canadian Premier League.

# SOCCER IN EDMONTON

Soccer is the most popular sport for young Canadians to play, according to a recent study. In a city where winter prevails for more than half of the year, the advantages of indoor soccer are evident.

Over the past few years, the demand for indoor soccer programs in the Edmonton area has skyrocketed, leading to the development of numerous indoor fields. The EMSA winter indoor league also has teams participating from Fort St. John, Grande Prairie and Red Deer, so our facilities serve players from cities far beyond Edmonton.

In terms of available facilities, the Edmonton Soccer Centre West, equipped with four indoor fields, has been joined by the East and South Soccer Centres, each with four fields. Additionally, Sherwood Park, Spruce Grove, Fort Saskatchewan, and most recently, St. Albert, have embraced the trend by incorporating indoor fields. Our community has transitioned from having just one indoor field to an impressive total of 19 fields in under two decades serving Edmonton and its surrounding areas. **But this isn't enough.** 

This growth mirrors the increasing interest from thousands of players, with the numbers continuing to grow each day, and we need a facility that can sustain this growth.

Delivering a top-notch soccer facility for Edmonton's youth remains one of our Association's top objectives. With an increased demand for youth soccer, from minis to U19, paired with an ongoing need for facility and programming options across the city, this investment in infrastructure positions Edmonton as not only a leader in its commitment to enhancing the sport's performance and development, but also allows our facility to be a community asset that has the power to impact some of the most important lives around us — our youth.

Together, we can not only build a one-of-a-kind facility that helps to empower and instill confidence into our youth but celebrates and connects our communities as well.

# **COMPARABLE FACILITIES** Edmonton Soccer Dome

The Edmonton Soccer Dome stands as the largest sports dome in Canada, boasting an expansive playing surface spanning 135,000 square feet. This state-of-the-art air-supported structure, sits atop a FIFA Quality Pro-approved artificial turf surface.

The realization of the Edmonton Scottish Society's vision for a top-notch sports facility was a journey that began long before the facility opened its doors to the public. Renowned for the excellence of their outdoor grass fields, the Edmonton Scottish Society took proactive steps to bring the dream of the Edmonton Soccer Dome to fruition, providing a year-round, non-boarded play environment for sports enthusiasts.



# The Saskatoon Sports Centre Inc. (SSCI)

Formally established as a non-profit corporation in 1993, the Saskatoon Sports Centre Inc. (SSCI) originated when representatives from Saskatoon Adult Soccer Inc. (SASI) and Saskatoon Youth Soccer Inc. (SYSI) formed a committee aimed at fundraising for the construction of an indoor soccer facility. With the collaborative support of the City of Saskatoon, various organizations, and individuals, the Saskatoon Kinsmen/Henk Ruys Soccer Centre celebrated its inaugural game in 1998. Since then, SSCI has proudly served as the home for over 10,000 soccer players annually, contributing significantly to the growth and vibrancy of the sport in the community. In 2003, the soccer community recognized the need for further growth, concluding that an additional facility was essential. The design incorporated a single indoor facility along with two outdoor artificial grass fields and hardcourt surfaces to cater to the evolving needs of the soccer enthusiasts. Now, SSCI owns and operates the two world-class facilities that enjoy over 1.4 million visitors annually.
